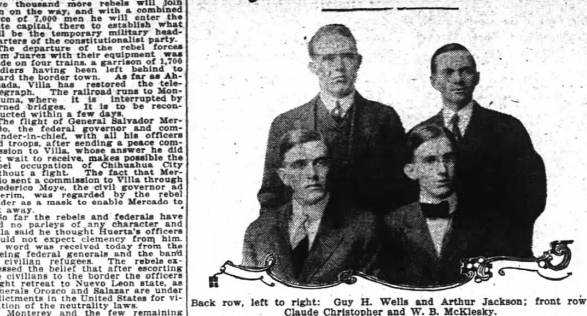

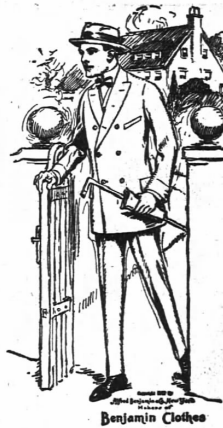

28 HOMELESS MEN DIE IN LODGING HOUSE FIRE
