Washington, December 22.—The new bill affecting the currency, banking and finance of the country, which will go into effect on January 1, is one of the most far-reaching measures relating to finance that has been passed in many years.

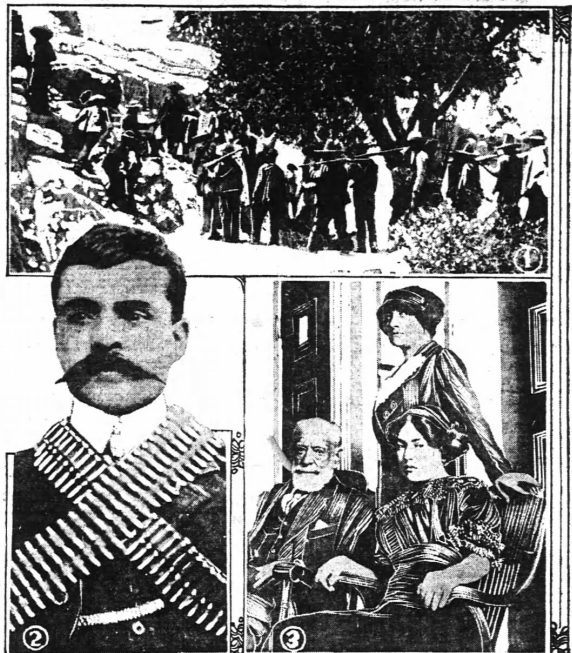
