SUGAR BATTLE IS LOST BY LOUISIANA GROWERS

Attorney General Rules Cuban Sugar Is Entitled to a Low Duty.

Washington, February 26.—Louisiana sugar growers lost the second round of their fight to keep up the duty on sugar today when Attorney General McKennan handed down an opinion that Cuban sugar is entitled to enter the United States at all times during the life of the present reciprocity treaty, on payment of a duty of 30 per cent less than other sugars.
