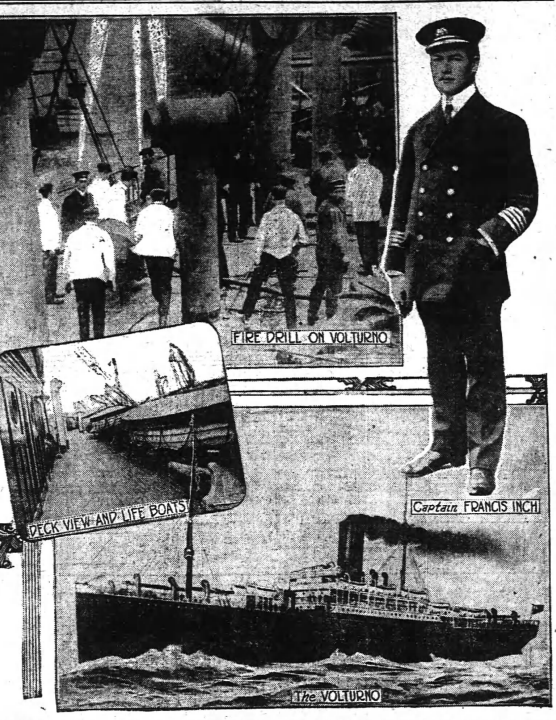

BOARD INDEPENDENCE AND SPECIAL TAX URGED

The deplorable condition in the public schools of Atlanta are clearly set forth in a communication from Superintendent William M. Slaton.

There is much crowding in a school. It is a crime to have to require one teacher to instruct sixty children. It is impossible for her to individualize. The moral, mental and physical interests of each child must really suffer. Really, thirty is the largest number a teacher ought to have in the class, but forty should be the maximum number. We ought to have as many new school houses as necessary to reduce the maximum number of children in a room to forty. We have sixteen basement rooms for the whites, and two for the blacks. In the basement, rooms are being added with open doors, forcing nervous cases into the streets of helpless children.

James Park's Condition. James Park has a worse condition, with two basements. Only one class of James Park from toilet. In Home Park school, there is a school, we have had to add a class in the basement. In English Avenue school there must be a class in the basement. In State Street school there is one class in the basement; in Tenth Street school, two classes in the basement. In the Home Park school, the basement is in Formwalt school, one class in the basement. In the Home Park school, three rooms in the basement, poorly ventilated. In the negro schools there are two basement rooms at Peach Street school. In many of these basements artificial light must be used. The eyes of the children are strained. They complain of headaches. These conditions are fatal in a civilized community. It is a crime to train not to wound anybody, but to train one fellow citizen of the actual conditions, so that public opinion may substitute better provisions for the children.

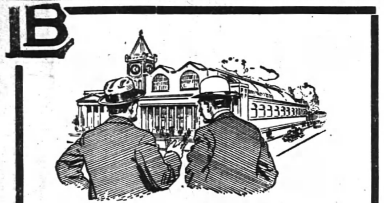
