### LEUTENANT BECKER ASKS JUSTICE GOFF TO GRANT NEW TRIAL

Convicted New York Police Officer Asks Retrial on Murder Charge Through Four Grounds

UNDER DEATH SENTENCE FOR KILLING ROSENTHAL  
Statement of Sam Schepps on His Return to New York Is Likely to Play Part if Trial Is Granted

(By Associated Press.)  
NEW YORK, June 5.—New trial for Charles Becker, the police lieutenant convicted of the murder of Herman Rosenthal and now in the death house at Sing Sing, was sought in the supreme court late yesterday, on four grounds namely:

First, that new evidence had been discovered which showed that the verdict was contrary to law and against the weight of the evidence; that Sam H. Isaac, a juror, was absent from the jury room on several occasions when he visited a dentist office fourth, that a new trial should be granted in the interest of justice.

The action was made before Justice Goff, who presided. Becker's counsel, Joseph A. Stuy, Becker's lawyer, submitted several affidavits and affidavits which have already been made public. These affidavits were taken with Isaac, who has returned to New York from Cuba. These affidavits are in support of the contention that Becker was not the murderer of Jack Rose in the murder case, and that the testimony should have been considered as such. Frank A. Wood, the assistant prosecuting attorney who conducted the prosecution, opposed the action, on which the court did not rule.
