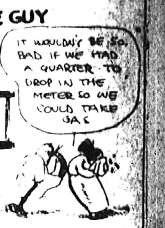

The Fulton county commission Thursday voted unanimously to begin work on the resurfacing of Peachtree road between Fifteenth street and Buckhead and agreed definitely to pave the road between the city limits and the Buckhead road.
