It is interesting, if not d'ery consoling, to hear that the cost of food is five times higher in Brasil than in the United States. "We do not eat eggs in Brazil," an American resident of that country is quoted as asying: "that sort of thing is no longer done. Nowadays, if a man likes eggs, he saves up and buys one. In the best Brazillian restaurants the order is stripped of its final 's' and is called "Ham and egg." It costs, too."

There are doubtless many lands where living is as expensive as in this country. If not more so. The reien of high prices is practically world-wide and, in some respects, is based upon a common cause. There is, for instance, a widely prevalent shortage in the supply of beef, so that the United States must look chiefly to its own resources for cattle raising, if it would find relief in this particular item. Each nation has its peculiar problems where the cost of living is concerned and each must work out its own solution. Some commoditive are high everywhere; others vary in price from land to land. Economists believe, or rather hope, that through careful study and co-operative effort along lines of improved methods of agriculture and distribution the average scale of prices the world over may be appreciably reduced. With this end in view it has been auggested that an international conference be held to inquire into the high cost of living.

"A week or so ago it was reported that five hundred thousand eggs came into New York from Germany on a single day. Testerday morning's papers told of the arrival of a thousand tons of Argentine beef in New York. Tarif reform was the first logical step toward breaking up that tyrannous system of monopoly which has oppressed the American public; it has removed one of the conditions on which monopoly throve. Further legislation is needed and doubtless will soon take form and effect. The next griat task before Congress is that of clarifying and vitalizing the laws pertainting to trust. This work will be done in the same spirit of prudence and Justice that attended tariff revision. One of the distinctively reasuring passages in the Presidents' recent message was that in which he declared:

It is of capital importance that the business.

And either directly or indirectly they will touch the great practical problem of the cost of living.

The cost of living must be reduced naturally through a greater production of food supplies. For several decades past the country's population has been outstripping the agricultural output. We have a continually greater number of mouths to feed but no corresponding increase in the production of food. So long as this continues, we shall be perplexed with the cost-of-living problem.

Penny Lunches

There is food for much interesting reflection in the announcement that last year the public school children of seven American cities spent more than a million and a half dollars for penny lunches. It is doubtful that money was ever invested to better pur-pose or with truer economy. The cost to the aver-age child was not more than five cents a week for

doubtful that money was ever invested to better purpose or with truer economy. The cost to the average child was not more than five cents a week for the school term; the returns were sounder health, keener minds, easier discipline and a more completely rounded plan of education.

There are communities where the penny lunch scheme is scarcely needed. In towns or villages where every child comes from a well-kept home and easis a hot dinner at his own table or is provided with a nutritious lunch when he leaves for school, there is no serious problem of this kind to be metel. But in the larger cities where many pupils do not receive such care, the penny lunch is a blessing beyond measure.

"It was at first contemplated," says the Louiswille Courier-Gournal, "to provide the child whose parents worked out all day with a healthful substitute for cheap candies and partly decayed fruits. It was found that practically all the pupils were sager to become patrons of the school lunch counter and the scope of service was broadened accordingly. The advantages of the plan were soon apparent. The children saved money and got better food. The school lunch was an aid to discipline. Many of the children acquired a taste for simple, wholesome dishes with which they had been unacquainted at home. Mothers of pupils beam asking for instructions how to prepare these dishes."

There is perhaps no reform that means more to individual and social welfare than the reform of food; and where could south work be more appropriately done than at school? Whoever it was that conceived and made practicable the penny-lunch idea should rank among the great benefactors.




