



It is the biggest corn crop in the State's history. It means not only more money to be kept at home, more independence for the farm and, therefore, a richer measure of prosperity for all interests.

Naturally, the people of Georgia regard with the hearttest favor a movement that brings such results; and it is chiefly the boys' corn club that are to be credited. They have been generously encouraged during the past year, but they should, and doubtless will, receive more liberal support in the year ahead. It should be remembered that the directing force behind the clubs is the State College of Agriculture, ably assisted by the federal department of agriculture and by public spirited and department of agriculture a

any assisted by the received department of agricul-ture and by public spirited agencies and individuals. The College of Agriculture merits in this, as in all other branches of its work, the State's unstinted aid.




