It should be worth far more ten years benete than today; its equipment and facilities for handling traffic should constantly improve; it should srow apace with Georgia's expanding commerce and be continually more serviceable to the people.

These considerations are much more important than that of the road's mere revenue; indeed, they embrace the revenue question. The end most to be desired is that the Western and Atlantie shall be steadily developed and handed down to future generations as an even-increasing heritage. If, then, a long-term lease is necessary to encourage or justify the lessee in double-tracking the line between Atlanta and Chattanooga and in otherwise upbuilding the road's wfile-ency and value, such a lease is distinctly a good business proposition.
