



From every quarter of the Union, leaders in the cause of good roads express gratification that the next Congress is to be held in the South and in doing so they pay well considered tributes to Georgia and its capital city. Mr. Logan Waller Page, director of the National Office of Public Roads, declares:

"The main reasons for selecting Atlanta were:
First, that we considered more good could be done by holding the Congress there than in any other Southern State, as Georgia is one of the way department, although it is spending much money on road work; second, it seemed, on account of its central location in the South, more convenient for the attending delegates than any other city with equal facilities. It is my belief that the Congress will be the largest road congress ever held and that the exhibits will be the gress ever held and that the exhibits will be the best ever made at a road meeting."

J. E. Pennyuseder, secretary of the American Highway Association, under the auspices of which the road congress is held, states that the selection of Atlanta was due to the very general conviction that the South is logically entitled to the Congress, "party in geographical sequence and party because of the sphendid progress which the South is making along all lines of industry."

"One of the serious problems of the nation is that which has to do with the adjustment of the production and consumption of food products, so as to lighten the burden resting upon both producer and consumer, Nowhere is there a more promising field for vast agricultural production than the South, and nowhere is there a more carnist and sincere effort being made to develop natural resources."


