



The poorest householder is compelled to spend extra money and work for cleaning, painting and papering. Smoke contains acids, ammonia, arsente and carbon which are highly injurious. It causes stone and mortar to crack and crumble, corrodes all metal work and cuts off smullipt, which is no essential to health. It not only hastens tubercular trouble but also aggravates penumonia and produces serious throat and one diseases."






