Indeed, we are told that wool would now beyond the reach of all save a wealthy few, ere it not for the fact that industry has become ed in utilizing the so-called by-products and wool ubstitutes. The production of sheep, like that of ubstitutes. The production of sheep, like that of ive stock generally, has failen far short of the in-rease in population; "the wool clip of the world is much smaller per capita than it was a few years ago, much smaller per capita than it was also year ago. Beep ranges have given ways to farms or citles, and pastoral life in all its aspects has steadily declined. This account of conditions naturally makes one very thankful that the tariff on wool has been re-moved. If there is only one yard of wool available moved. If there is only one said of each a sport of means, for each of us, on a basis of per capita apportionment, surely it ought not to be taxed. Taking off the tariff will scarcely stimulate the birth-rate among sheep ther in this country or abroad, but it will certainly elieve us of one elem ent of cost and will encourage the importation of wool to piece out our meage domestic supply. Wherefore, there is no apparent reason why American manufacturers of woolen hould quarrel with the new tariff, the fact is they ave ceased quarreling and are steadily down to effi-ient methods. In this, as in other industries, the

new tariff is demonstrating its fairness and wisdom. The wool shortage suggests, furthermore, the in-viting opportunity which sheep raising offers every part of the country that is naturally suited to this usiness. Georgia's wool clip is not enough to turn the national balance but it is enough to indicate what could be done on the State's thousands of idle acres.
