Military men in Atlanta are drawing their own conclusions from the fact that the United States government, for the first time in history, is sending voluntarily war equipment to the national guard of Georgia and to national guards all over the country, and ordering instruction in war tactics to be given in all the government's training schools, both in the state and abroad.

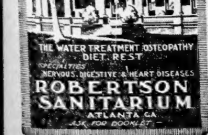
