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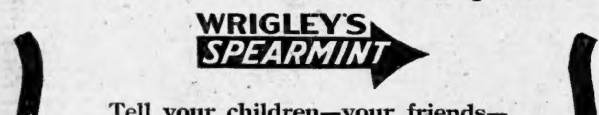

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Greek, Home From Wars, Recites Stories of Valor

George Nikas, First From the Field, Gathers Friends About Him and Tells of Terrible Bulgarian and His Massacres.

George Nikas, one of the 250 Greeks who left Atlanta in January to fight in the Macedonian war, has returned home after seeing service in some of the hottest fighting. He is the first of the band of Greek patriots to return, and his arrival has excited a great interest in the Atlanta Greek colony, every member of which is eager for first hand tidings of the war.

Others of the 250 Atlanta Greeks are expected home from time to time, though some of them will never make the trip back to their native country. There has been yet no accounting for the dead and missing who left Atlanta to see their country.

Nikas returned to Atlanta Friday noon, and since that time his place of business at 45 Mitchell street has been crowded with his countrymen, eager to hear the tale of battle from one who participated in them.

SAW SOME REAL FIGHTING.

One of the thirty men who survived a fierce conflict at Gevgheli on Jan. 2, the first of the battles and the only one in which they were surprised by a division of the Bulgarian army. Nikas tells a graphic tale, though it is difficult at times for an American to follow him, as he has forgotten some of the English since going to Greece to fight. Present perfection of Greek phrases are confusing to an American, but his complete lack of an difficulty in following his descriptions of the scenes witnessed by him.

Nikas' story follows as translated by Greek consul in Atlanta, Demetrios Vafaridis:

"I went from Atlanta to New York, and from New York immediately to Elirous, where I was assigned to a company of 150 Greeks in the left wing of the army. We and 2,000 Servians were sent to Gevgheli, and were surprised there on June 23 by a force of Bulgarians numbering 20,000. In the unequal fight which followed, the Servians were all killed and half of our company were lost. The Bulgarians being not only numerous but well equipped with twice as many rifles as we had.

"The remainder of the company of 150 men, a protected entrance, and I managed to hold it for three hours, at the end of which time the Bulgarian soldiers of the Greek army, which had been ordered to our position, came to our assistance. The division advanced against the Bulgarians, and drove them to the east of Dorian in retreat. By this time only sixty of the original company of 150 Greeks were left, and we were ordered to a small bridge over the river Vardar, with instructions to hold it against the advance of the Bulgarians. There we were encountered by a number of Bulgarian irregulars, and were kept from cutting off the way of retreat for the Greek division. I sent a call for assistance, and 300 men were sent to us. 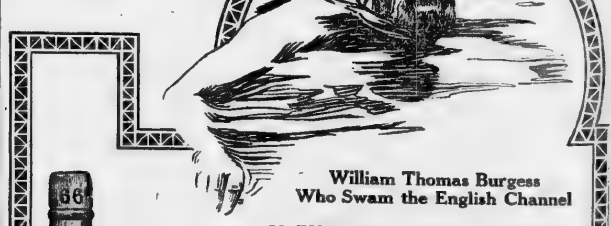

THE BIG THREE OF HISTORY.
The Glory that was Greece, the Grandeur that was Rome, the Trichardness that were Yale—where have they passed today? Alas! their ancient Goats are bleating far from home. From old New Haven's trees of elm and oak the Apollo was Time when they ruled the field, time was they had the stuff. And rushed the ball across on first or second down. But now across the map they're sliced off in the rough. Amid the Yanks and Keds, the Cardinals and Browns.

When will they come again—the Alexanders reign?
The Caesars of renown—the Chadwick and the Coys?
When will they come again to rule by hill and plain,
And stand as though they were the one Triumphant Note?

THE YALE RENAISSANCE.
Apparently the Yale renaissance is not yet in order. The new regime hasn't yet had a full, fair trial but among those who like it extraneously are Maine, W. and J. and Coles. With Princeton and Harvard '04 to be heard from.

Yale has been slipping back for some time—back at least from her standard of excellence—but it was thought a new order would be established this fall—in new order that would accomplish no mirables but at least slip her nearer to the ancient by way. In place of such Yale is just a trifle further back now than she has been at this time since 1910, with only a miracle to save her from utter demotion.

But they are not the old-time Yale eleven by a good many necks.

Quite evidently there must be something out of gear, but just what it is something is known by narrow vision. The best available clue seems to be that where Yale once had the greatest system of them all, today she hasn't any system whatsoever.

After all these matters of triumph and defeat come and go in change, the creature, The Six Legs Browns and the Boston Nationals once had baseball. But not today. The Giants for a long time were the best hope of their circuit. Yale was rampant above Harvard for a long time and it so happens that the Crimson is due. And it's hard to check a bloke who is due, if said bloke insists upon going to it.

And in the meanwhile Col. A. A. Stagg, of Chicago University, is piling along with his usual, usually, holding, as it were, the even typical hoop of his way. His main style now is in Minnesota and when November 13 arrives there should be enough for displaced to cover a large back section of the West.

NOT YET.
The latest winter league shift has Speaker coming to the Yanks and the Cubs moving to the Red Sox. But up to the precise moment of casting to pose Mack has yet to trade Brierley and Collins for Gus Williams of the 666's.

THE KINK AGAIN.

EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIP Princeton-Harvard Game Opens Series

(By Associated Press.)
NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—The opening game of the annual eastern football championship series will be played at Princeton, N. J., on Saturday, when the eleven of Harvard and Princeton universities meet in their annual combat. This will be the sixteenth contest between the teams of the two institutions since 1877, when the Tigers and Crimson first mingled on the football field.

There have been a number of breaks in the series between Princeton and Harvard, 4 victories, 13 defeats. Judging from the form displayed by the two eleven which are to clash in the most important game of the east this week, Harvard should be a slight favorite, but Princeton adherents note the peculiar fact that the Crimson has not defeated the Orange and Black on the "Tiger" home field in many years. As a result a tradition has sprung up in Princeton to the effect that Harvard cannot win from Princeton at Princeton any more than it can defeat Yale in the Cambridge stadium.

So far as football, pioneer activity and traditions are concerned, Princeton has a decided advantage over Harvard for the Tigers were on the previous several years ahead of the Crimson and have made football history which needs no apology when compared with that of Harvard, now carefully guarded as a closely guarded secret.

Princeton football dates back to 1880, when, aided by Hutzler, the Tigers put American intercollegiate football in the category of United States college sports. For more than forty-four years Princeton has played football each season, and the total number of games run into surprising figures. Her record to date shows 347 games, of which 300 have been won, 48 lost and 13 tied.

Harvard inaugurated football at Cambridge in 1874, and to date has played exactly the same number of games as Princeton, but not with the same success. Of the 347 games, 291 have been won, 47 lost, and 9 tied.

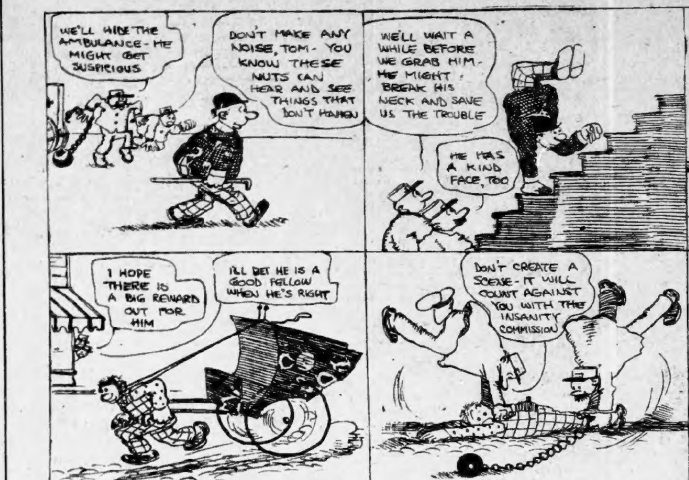

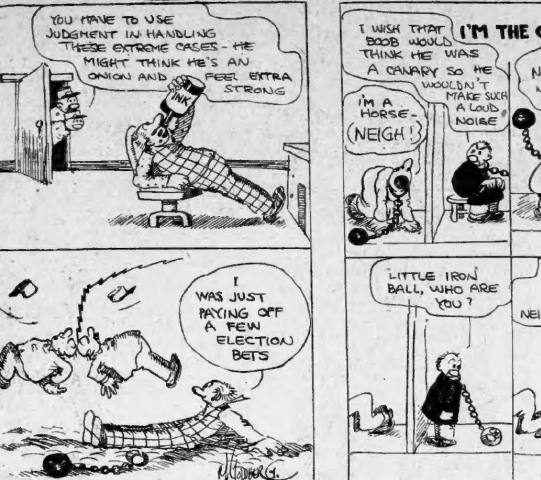
