

The Three Candidates in Mexico.

The voters of Mexico will have at least a variety of candidates to choose from in their forthooming presidential election. Frederico Gamboa, the nomines of the Catholic party, is seasoned in staterart and diplomacy, a man of honerable record, of unquestioned ability and singularly free from the old factional intrigues. Manuel Calero, head of the Liberal ticket, is said to be in high favor among the followers of former President Madero, though lacking the support of the army. His party holds a large majority in the Chamber of Deputies and is distinctly progressive in its temper. The third candidate is Felix Diaz, an expless of the famous dictator whose return to Mozico has lately been rumored. Dias is nominally the standard bearer of a so-called Labor party but its seems doubtful that he represents more than personal ambition. He rele in the betrayal and death of Madero was anything but admirable. He is implicably hards but here are the contraction of the former president and by Liberals at large. als at large

Until the Democratic congress gives the nation a flexible, instead of a rigid currency, and a banking system that will be the instrument rather than the master of business, it will have gone only half its great eighistive it will have gone only half its great legislative

The President realizes that now is the most op portune hour for the enactment of a satisfactory banking and currency bill, now while the attention of Congress is free from other matters and while pub-Congress is free from other matures and while "pub-lic interest is focused upon this one issue. When the regular section begins divers other problems will demand thought and action. Circumstances will be far less favorable for prompt, and at the same time, well considered legislation in this regard. The bill now before the Senate committee has been carefully weighed and everwhelmingly passed in the House, Its essential provisions are admittedly sound. It comes nearre harmonising all elements or homest opinion than any other measure of the kind ever processed.

The President is, therefore, well warranted in urging the speediest reasonable action on the part of the Senate; and the fact that he is bending his finiteness to that end is assurance that such action will be taken. Indeed, the administration's task in putting through the currency bill is in many respects less difficult than in the case of the tariff bill. In the latter measure, there was a grave divergence of opinion among the Democrats themselves as well as between Democrats and Republicans. There was accruely a schedule that did not provide spirited dehate in the party causus. Yet, all differences were harmonized. The general purpose of the currency bill, on the other hand, commends itself to all interests that are worthy of consideration and to practically all members of both parties in Congress. There cally all members of both parties in Congress. There are differences of opinion as to its details but few, if any differences at to the urgent need of some such

measure.


