



Georgia's Opportunity in Cattle Raising. Predictions that the price of beefsteak will go to a dollar a pound have brought forth divers suggestions for increasing the production of cattle. The simplest plan yet proposed is that every farm in the country raise at least two bewees a year. This enterprise is particularly commendable to the South where every natural circumstance is favorable to the liveaciet industry.

The climate and soil of Georgia are ideally suited to eatile raising. The temperate whaters reduce to a minforum the cost of housing and feeding. Open pairturage is available the year around. Porage of the finest quality can be grown more easily in this section than in any other part of the Union. There are thousands of acres now idle which could be used for this purpose with rich profits to the Individual owner and immeasurable bendets to the State and country as a whole.

If three hundred thousand Georgia farms produced such the States and country as a whole.

If there hundred thousand Georgia farms produced such the States annual output would amount to forty-dry million dollars; or, if each farm produced fire a year—and that could easily be done—they would yield more than one bundred and twelve millions annually, at the low estimate of seventy-five dollars a head.

The suptaining and stimulating effect of so much additional wealth would count wondrously for the dependence of the farm and for the progress of all other interests. It is calculated that Georgia now lacks some thirty-seven million dollars a year of making enough money out of its cotton crop to pay for its food supplies.
