Germany's Latest and Largest Specimen of Air Craft Blown Up When 900 Feet Above Ground With 27 Passengers

GUEST ON TRIAL FLIGHT ONLY MAN WHO ESCAPES

German Aviator Also Suffers From Aviation Accidents. Three Officers of Flying Corps Meet Death at Berlin

BERLIN, Oct. 17.—The newest and largest of the Zeppelins, the "L-1" was destroyed in mid-air by an explosion at 10:15 o'clock this morning.

The disaster occurred just above the main street of Johannisthal, while the dirigible was 900 feet high, making a trial preliminary to its acceptance as a specimen of the new German aerial navy.

The shattered bulk of the airship, a mass of twisted canvas and crumpled aluminum, dropped 800 feet to the public highway. Hundreds of people who had been watching the dirigible rushed to the scene.

Only one man was seen to escape the crash. He was the pilot, Lieutenant Von Blum, of the Queen Augusta Grenadier guards who was making the trip as a guest who was badly injured.

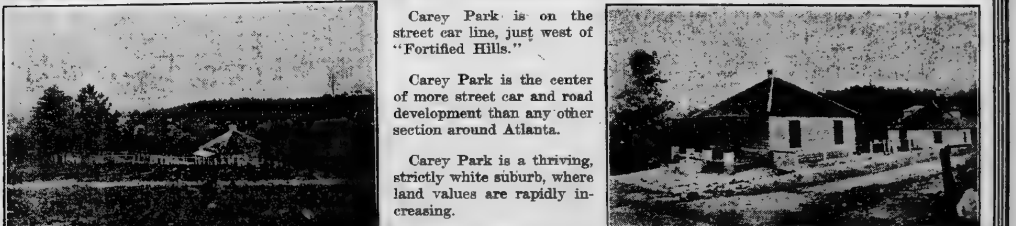

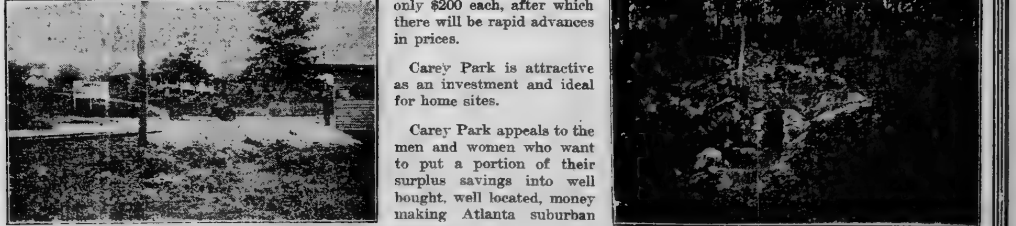
