In removing William Sulzer from the governorably of New York, the court of impeachment has fulfilled public especiation. The trial opened with popular sentiment distinctly in the governor's favor; it was the earnest wish. If not the belief, of great numbers of people the country over that he would vindicate himself of every serious charge. Geenral option was that his errors, whatever they might have been, were slips of judgment rather than of character; and everyone knew that the chunders which Tammany set rolling about his head were provoked not by the wrongs he had done but by the right he was striving to do.

As the trial proceeded, however, the inherent peakings of Sulter became more and more evident. The hope that he would face his accusers boildy and put them down with a plain, straightforward tale was shelled. He planed his faith to technicalities instead of candor. Under his evasiveness and silence, the public's trust in the man gradually waned. There was a sincer and a very wholesome desire on the part of most people to believe him innocent despite supplicious direcumstances, but as day followed day and he word of stouthearted, reasonable defense came from the governor, the feebbesses of his cause grew from the governor, the feebleness of his cause grev unmistakable. The court's verdict was morally fore

immistabable. The court's verdict was merally foregone.

The conviction of William Sulter, however, in no wise vindicates the Tammany machine that attacked him. The governor, stripped of his power and prestige, is regarded more in sorrow than in anger; the court level acquitted him of the more criminal charges he faced and declared that he should not be disqualified from seeking and holding public office again. But for he corrupt Tammany ring that stood in the hypocritical role of accuser, there is no trace of spoular sympathy or approval.

Tammany has its revenge on the governor who dared defy it but whose 'acutchoon hore a fatal blot.' It is a revenie, however, which premises to cost the machine dearly. It has served, as perhaps no other middlent could, by unite all friends of free government in New York state against this bruial oligarchy. The people have seen that no governor who is bound to Tammany can be loyal to them and that no governor who opposes Tammany can aurvive, unless he is of truit herede mettle. Furthermore, they have seen that so long as the Tammany ring is left in control the chance of useful, liberal legislation are practically widd.


