



Over a year ago they purchased, on attractive terms, the property at 333 Simpson street and tree inaugurated an industrial home and school. The Initial outlay for machinery and equipment, however, was naturally much larger than the early income of the institution could cover and at the

however, was naturally much larger than the exhibitions income of the institution could cover and at, the same time provide for deferred payments on the property. To the extent that sorely limited funds would permit, excellent work has been dense; but the time has now arrived when the school must either be helped or permanently closed.

A remaining indebtedness of two thousand dollars on the site and buildings is past due. It must be met by the first Tuesday in November, or all the resources and faith that have been put into this endeavor will be sacrifiedd. An additional thousand dollars is necessary as a working ceptial.
