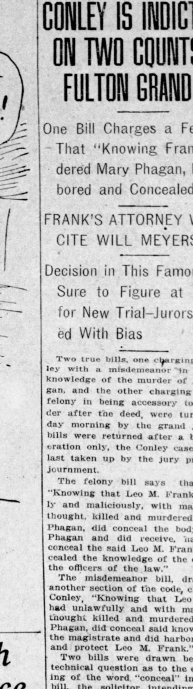
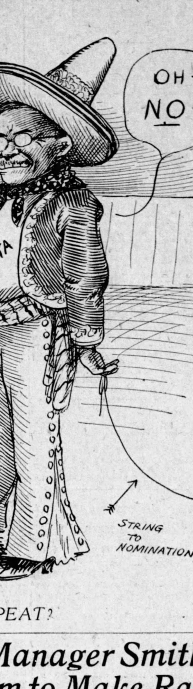

The Pith of Road Problems.

Every State and every county will do well to ponder these words from the constitution of the Ohio Good Roads Federation:

"We urge the adoption of a comprehensive and efficient plan of administration that will improve, maintain and unify as one complete system the public thoroughfares of the country, to the end that we may secure a national highway system, a state highway system and a township highway system, each a distinct unit yet all integral factors of a complete system of Good Roads everywhere."

It is doubtful that the needs of American road building were ever more sorely or trenchantly described. Unless the improvement and the maintenance of highways are conducted in accordance with some unified plan under which all sections of each county and all counties of each State and all States of the Union cooperate toward a common end, the labor and money spent on road work will produce only scattered and temporary results.

The great need of the Ohio Federation declares is the adoption of a comprehensive effort of administration whereby the various efforts of counties and States will be coordinated. Thus only can State systems and a national system of good roads be developed.

Georgia is especially in need of such a plan. Our individual counties are for the most part doing admirable work in improving their local roads; but we are wholly lacking in the means and machinery for unified, State-wide endeavor in this important field of public enterprise.

The elimination of Huerta from the future politics of Mexico, or rather from the forthcoming Presidential election, is one of the essential demands of our Government's policy. No regime of which he is the head will receive the recognition of the United States, nor will it command the support of any considerable portion of the Mexican people.

Perhaps the most interesting result of the day was the heavy decrease evidenced in the so-called "Progressive" ballot. The Bull Moose candidate polled only some sixty-five hundred votes as compared with over thirteen thousand cast for Roosevelt in the Presidential election in 1912.

Had the Republican majority in the Third district been a large one, it would not have been especially surprising, for by elections frequently go against the party in power. On the whole, the result is rather assuring than otherwise to national Democracy.
